

## Town & Country Bank restructures loan department, names 2 new board members

Executive Vice President P. West Martin has been named the bank's first chief credit officer.

Martin will have responsibility over all credit administration. He has 40 years of credit experience. As the bank's chief lending officer, Martin oversaw development of a loan portfolio that was launched during the bank's startup phase.

Jason Hutsepiller has been promoted to the position of senior vice president and chief lending officer for the bank. He has been with the bank since 2014.

Hutsepiller will be responsible for new loan production, relationship management and loan processing.

Town & Country was established in 2008. It maintains one retail office in St. George and a loan production office in Sandy. Earlier this year, Town & Country won the "Best of State" statue award recognizing it as the top business in Utah.
